Butterfly Weed, Asclepsias

(Asclepsias tuberosa)

Asclepsias tuberosa, commonly called butterfly weed, is a herbaceous perennial that is prized for its bright orange flowers that bloom from late spring throughout the summer. The flowers are a nectar source for many butterflies and leaves are a food source for Monarch butterfly larvae (caterpillars). Butterfly weed grows in a clump up to 1-3 feet tall and is drough tolerant and deer resistant.



Plant Care: Grow butterfly weed in a sunny location in average, dry to medium, well-drained soil. Remove spent flowers to encourage reblooming and prevent self-sowing (mature plants may freely self-seed in the landscape). This plant does not transplant well due to its deep taproot.
