Hemerocallis spp. Daylily-Yellow (Yellow Daylily)

Individual daylily flowers last for only a day, but the plant produces a succession of blooms for three to four weeks. They usually bloom from early- to mid-summer.



Plant Care: Plant your daylilies in spring or in autumn. Choose a spot, preferably with partial shade during the hottest hours, knowing that the daylily flowers more when it has sun for part of the day. Ideally, fertilize the soil before planting.

Watering: Water regularly the first weeks. Watering daylilies is recommended in spring until flower buds form, especially if it is dry outside. Once established, daylilies will handle drought well.
