Ilex vomitoria 'Nana Dwarf Yaupon Holly'



Dwarf Yaupon Holly

A dense rounded form of dwarf yaupon holly. This plant grows 4 to 6 feet in height and width with infrequent pruning. Unpruned it will eventually grow 7 to 10 feet. It is ideal for foundation planting. It can be sheared into a formal hedge or into topiary shapes if desired. The growth rate is slow. The small gray-green leaves have no spines. The female plant rarely produces berries. This plant is evergreen. No pests or diseases are of major concern.

PLANT CARE AND WATERING

Plant in full sun or light shade. Once established it will withstand drought very well. Water accordingly until established. It tolerates poor soil conditions. Space plants 4 to 5 feet apart. Plant several feet back from driveway, walkway and lawn. When pruning be sure to leave the bottom wider than the top so the top will not shade out the bottom.
