Creeping Phlox (Phlox sublata 'Emerald Blue')

A dazzling carpet of color in late spring! Beautiful masses of deep blue flowers top creeping stems and create an attractive groundcover or accent in a rock garden. Also known as 'Creeping Phlox' Phlox sublata attracts butterflies.



Plant Care: It's a good idea to shear this plant back and clean up any dead foliage in early summer, just after it's finished blooming. This will produce denser foliage and will encourage it to rebloom. Water deeply, regularly in first growing season to establish root system. Once established, reduce frequency. Phlox tolerates mild drought, but likes regular watering (weekly or more often) in extreme heat. Fertilize in early spring.
