Sweet Box (Sarcococca hookeriana var. humilis)

Sarcococca hookeriana, commonly called sweet box, is a low-growing, broadleaf evergreen shrub or groundcover for woodland gardens. Var. humilis grows only 1 to 2 feet tall and spreads slowly by stolons 6 feet wide or more, over time, in shady areas of the landscape. Lustrous, lanceolate, leathery, dark green leaves are evergreen. Tiny, tubular, fragrant white flowers, which are about 1/2 inch long, bloom in the leaf axils in March and April.



Plant Care: Sarcococca hookeriana grows well in organically rich, acidic, moist, well-drained soils in part- to full-shade. Leaves lose luster in full sun. Prune in spring after flowering to maintain attractive shape. It has no serious insect or disease problems.

Watering: This plant does best with consistent moisture.
